

Current Project Update

Driving across the hills, you will notice works happening everywhere! The Andrews Labor Government has been making significant investments in our community from day one.

Belgrave Carpark - Very soon it will be much easier for commuters across the Dandenong Ranges to travel into Melbourne for work, study and leisure. The new multi-deck car park with 640 spaces is expected to be completed later this year.

Angliss Hospital Stage II - We're investing \$112 million to expand the Angliss Hospital in Upper Ferntree Gully and early works including demolition have begun. The project will sustain approximately 330 construction jobs and is expected to be completed in 2025.

Health

The 2023 State Budget includes significant funding for health infrastructure in the outer-east.

Every Victorian should be able to get the healthcare they need, when they need it, close to home. That's why we're starting works to redevelop and expand Maroondah Hospital - and renaming it after the late Queen Elizabeth II.

The State Budget continues to fund **Priority Primary Care Clinics**. These clinics provide exceptional urgent care and take pressure off emergency rooms, ensuring that patients receive the care they need in a timely and efficient manner

New comprehensive Women's Health Clinics at Maroondah and Casey Hospitals will change the way women's health issues are treated, providing care and support for conditions like endometriosis, pelvic pain, polycystic ovary syndrome, perimenopause and menopause.

We are committed to investing in the health and wellbeing of our community and these initiatives continue the significant work we have already done.

Community

Local families in **Cockatoo** and their four-legged friends will have improved places to stretch their legs, with the Andrews Labor Government delivering on its promise to upgrade the dog park at Alma Treloar Reserve.

Early Childhood

The 2023 State Budget has invested a further \$1.8 billion into our unprecedented Early Childhood reform - giving our kids the best start and the best life with Free Kinder.

Currently, all three and four-year-old children in Victoria are eligible to access up to 15 hours of funded kindergarten per week.

Over the next decade, Four-Year-Old Kindergarten will transition to 'Pre-Prep' increasing to a universal 30-hour a week program of play-based learning for every fouryear-old child in Victoria.

Environment

Victorians remember the **State Electricity Commission (SEC)** - it meant a fair deal on your power prices and good, stable jobs for workers.

That's why we're bringing it back - to drive down power bills and create thousands of jobs in renewable, government-owned energy. An initial \$1 billion investment in the SEC will help deliver 4.5 gigawatts of power – the equivalent replacement capacity of Loy Yang A – through renewable energy projects. Bringing back the SEC won't just mean more renewable energy, lower power bills and reduced carbon emissions - it'll also help create 59,000 jobs.

This Budget goes a long way to achieving our ambitious emissions reduction targets for Victoria, aiming to **reduce our emissions by 50% by 2030** and achieve net-zero emissions by 2050.
